General Lottery Rules

- x The PPS resident lottery is open to students who live within the district boundary. Students who live in other districts must wait until the intedistrict transfer application opens each spring, unless they have already received an intedistrict transfer for the next school year.

 - x Families may have to meet additional requirements in order for their students to be eligible for the lottery Families who do not fulfill requirements by a designated date will to their lottery result.

Lottery preferences:

- x Coenrolled siblingpreference Coenrolled siblings are brothers or sisters who live in the same household and will be enrolled in the same school/program at the same timeer colled sibling preference applies to an applicant's first choice where at least one siblinguisently enolled.
- x Income eligibilitypreference: Students who attend Head Start pkendergarten or qualify for Federally

The number of students directly certified is a subset of the total number of students eligible for free and reduced price meals. To determine the proportion of slots at each eligible lottery school or programe, t district direct certification rate is multiplied by 1.6s per guidance from the US Department of Agriculture.

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xLanguage groupings ual Language Immersion programs are most successful when students have diverse language backgrounds. Applicants are grouped by the language they have been speaking and listening to at home with their parent or guardian since birth. Neighborhoodly programs: James John, Scott and Sitton Spanish Immersion programs are open only to students who live within the school attendance boundaries.

xNeighborhoodgrouping For programs that are docated with neighborhood schools, students who live in the school attendance boundaries are a separate lottery group.

xRegionalpreference: FollowingResolution 4383, here are four K12 Spanish Immersion regions in PPS Kindergarten applicate who do not qualify for a neighborhood grouping are selected in the lottery above applicants who live in other regions. For example, a kindergarten applicant who lives in the Stephenson neighborhood, in SW Portland, will run through the Ainsworth Spanin mersion lottery before a student who lives in the Sabin neighborhood in NE Portla@de Page 5 for regional groupings.

xDr. Martin Luther King Jr Chinese Immersion Program: The groupings for this program include slots for
